

Guidelines for Contributors

1. Suggested areas and forms for contributions

With respect to the broad fields¹ indicated below, FPI welcomes contributions in the form of **original articles** on current issues and topics; **evaluation** of relevant programs, projects, and policies; **literature reviews** (of recently published / seminal books in the field); and **perspectives** on how the field should and will develop in the future.

- a) Public Policy
- b) Public Expenditure Management,
- c) Government Revenues (tax, non-tax and grants);
- d) Debt & Liability Management
- e) Treasury Management,
- f) Fiscal Decentralization,
- g) Government Accounts and Financial Management,
- h) Audit
- i) Project Management, Project Appraisal, Contract Design and Contract Management
- j) Public Private Partnerships (PPPs),
- k) Medium Term Fiscal Policy (MTFP),
- l) Central Finance Commission,
- m) Gender Budgeting
- n) E-governance,
- o) Statistics
- p) Monitoring and evaluation.

2. Submission of article

Authors are required to submit an electronic copy(soft copy) of the article in MS-WORD format (.docx format) via email to journal@fpibangalore.gov.in with the subject as “Article for FPI Journal”.

3. Editorial review

Submitted contributions will undergo a standard rigorous editorial and review process. Editors reserve the right to include, exclude, or allocate submissions to an appropriate issue.

4. Cover Page

The cover page shall contain the title of the manuscript, the author's name, and affiliation (designation, organisation name, postal address, phone, fax and E-mail) including acknowledgement if any.

5. Title Page

The title page should contain only the title which should be short and informative.

6. Abstract

Each manuscript should include an abstract of about 50 words.

7. Manuscript

The word count of the manuscript should not exceed 2500 words.

8. Headings

Major and secondary headings should be left justified in lower case and in bold.

9. Figures, Tables and Illustrations

They should be of high quality, inserted in the preferred location, numbered consecutively and appropriately titled.

10. References

References should be typed on a separate page, double-spaced, at the end of the paper. They must have complete information: Journal, Volume / no, Year of Publication, pages and names of authors.
